Vince Bertoni

Planning Director, City of Los Angeles

Vince Bertoni is the Planning Director for the City of Los Angeles. With more than 28 years of professional planning experience, Vince leads the largest city planning department in the nation. He is charged with developing policies that shape the future of the City and guide development decisions for a diverse and dynamic metropolis of over 4 million people. Prior to arriving in Los Angeles, Vince was the Director of Planning and Community Development for the City of Pasadena where he successfully managed Pasadena's city planning program through a General Plan update, a comprehensive visioning process that happens just once every 20 years. He has also served as Deputy Director for the City of Los Angeles and held lead planning posts for the cities of Beverly Hills, Santa Clarita, and Malibu.

Vince is a member of the California Planning Roundtable and has held several leadership positions with the California Chapter of the American Planning Association including President, Vice President for Policy & Legislation, Director of the Los Angeles Section, and Co-Chair of the American Planning Association's 2012 National Planning Conference. In addition, he has served on the Board of Directors of the League of California Cities and as President of the League's Planning & Community Development Department. Vince has been active on statewide legislation, having served on the Housing Element Reform Working Group formed by the State Assembly and Senate and testified before the State Senate on infill real estate development strategies.

Vince has a Bachelor's Degree in Transportation and Urban Geography from San Diego State University and is a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners.

Susan Bransen

Executive Director, California Transportation Commission

Ms. Bransen serves as the California Transportation Commission's (Commission) Executive Director, reporting to the thirteen-member Commission. As the primary advisor to the Commission, she has a major role in affecting the outcome of all policies and actions adopted by the Commission.

Ms. Bransen directs the affairs of the Commission including responsibility for programming and allocating billions in transportation funding annually for the construction of highway, passenger rail, transit and active transportation improvements throughout California. Most recently, she has led the effort to implement provisions of Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017. Through her leadership, the Commission is positioned to invest, in the spring of 2018, more than \$24 billion in state and federal funding to projects throughout California, including more than \$10 billion in funds generated through enactment of SB 1.

Ms. Bransen also serves as a liaison on behalf of the Commission with the Legislature and the California State Transportation Agency Secretary in formulating and evaluating policies, plans, and funding for California's transportation programs. She also serves as a member of the Toll Bridge Program Oversight Committee and the California Transportation Financing Agency.

Dr. Frances Edwards Deputy Director, National Transportation Safety & Security Center Mineta Transportation Institute

Frannie Edwards, M.U.P., Ph.D., CEM, is professor and director of the Master of Public Administration program at San Jose State University. She is also Deputy Director of the National Transportation Safety and Security Center at the Mineta Transportation Institute. She is a Certified Emergency Manager with over 20 years' experience in California. She is co-author with Dan Goodrich of *Introduction to Transportation Security*, twelve major publications for MTI, and over 30 articles. She provides emergency management plan writing, review and training for Caltrans, and Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority.

Fran Inman

Chair, California Transportation Commission Senior Vice President, Majestic Realty Company

Fran Inman directs government relations and community affairs activities for Majestic Realty Co., one of the nation's largest privately held real estate development companies. With a real estate portfolio totaling approximately 84 million square feet of commercial properties, Majestic Realty has offices in Los Angeles; Atlanta; Bethlehem, Dallas, Denver, Fort Worth, Las Vegas and Laredo.

Ms. Inman has served on the California Transportation Commission since 2010 and currently serves as incoming Chair. In 2013, Inman was also appointed as a founding member of the National Freight Advisory Committee and co-chaired the sub-committee on project delivery and operations.

Ms. Inman served as the chair of the board of the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce and serves as vice chair for the California Business Properties Association (CBPA). Darren Kettle

Executive Director, Ventura County Transportation Commission

Darren Kettle is the Executive Director of the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC), a position he started in October 2007. The Commission consists of one elected official from each city in the County, the five County Supervisors, and two public members – yes, that means 17 bosses. In his service to VCTC, Darren leads a small but very capable staff focused on improving transportation planning to ensure wise investment of transportation funds on a wide array of transportation projects programs, ranging from freeway and highway projects to bicycle and pedestrian projects and bus and rail projects. The Commission also operates Ventura County's intercity public transit system, known as VCTC Intercity, serving public transit riders commuting within Ventura County and into Los Angeles and Santa Barbara counties.

Darren has a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from the University of California, Santa Barbara and a Masters in Public Administration from California State University, San Bernardino. His professional career spans 28 years working for local government and regional transportation agencies. Prior to coming to VCTC he served in several senior positions with the county transportation agencies of Riverside and San Bernardino counties.

Marjie Kirn

Executive Director, Santa Barbara County Association of Governments

Marjie Kirn is the Executive Director of the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments, the Metropolitan Planning Organization, Regional Transportation Planning Agency and Local Transportation Authority for Santa Barbara County.

The Santa Barbara County Association of Governments is responsible for managing a \$1.5 billion 30-year transportation improvement program with 19 employees. Prior to joining SBCAG, Ms. Kirn was the Executive Director of the Merced County Association of Governments for the past four years. She was Deputy Director for the agency for 12 years prior to being promoted to Executive Director.

Therese McMillan assumed the position of Chief Planning Officer for the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority ("LA Metro") in April 2016. In that capacity, she provides executive leadership for Metro's planning, grant funding, and real estate functions. Key initiatives include the agency's proposed sales tax ballot measure and related long-range plan strategy; implementation of county "active transportation" programs; strategic fund program development; and emerging community initiatives such as public health and transportation access.

Prior to joining LA Metro, McMillan served as the Acting Administrator for the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) of the US Department of Transportation. During her almost 7 years at FTA, McMillan led reforms in transit safety, emergency response and resiliency investment; capital planning and oversight, and civil rights program development and oversight, including Title VI and ADA.

Before her career at FTA, McMillan was Deputy Executive Director of Policy at the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, the regional planning and funding agency for the nine-county San Francisco Bay area. During her time with MTC, Therese was an instructor in transportation funding and finance at the Mineta Transportation Institute, San Jose State University.

Habib Shamskhou President, Advance Mobility Group

Habib Shamskhou is a recognized authority on emerging advanced technologies in transportation with expertise in safety, mobility and program management. He pioneered several innovative transportation ITS projects in past 25 years. Early in his career he conducted first precursor system analysis for automated highway system for FHWA and from 1992-1998 he was one of the program manager of Automated Highway System (AHS) program. The National Automated Highway System Consortium was a \$200 million program in partnership with US Department of Transportation led by General Motors that concluded successfully in summer of 1998 by demonstration of first generation of hand-off, feet-off driving on I-15 in San Diego.

Charles "Muggs" Stoll Planning Director, San Diego Association of Governments

Charles Stoll, more commonly known as "Muggs", is the Director of Land Use and Transportation Planning for the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) in San Diego, California. He directs a team of over 30 professionals in developing critical land use and transportation planning initiatives for the San Diego region, such as the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan and the first Sustainable Communities Strategy pursuant to Senate Bill 375 in the State of California. Previously, Stoll was the *TransNet* Program Manager for SANDAG. *TransNet* is the half-cent regional sales-tax transportation program for San Diego County which involved developing strategies for securing matching transportation funds, the development of new performance measurement systems and implementation of an innovative regional environmental mitigation program. He also had the interim responsibility as SANDAG's Communications Director for four months until the position was permanently filled in 2007.

Stoll joined SANDAG in April 2007 after spending over twenty years with the California Department of Transportation in their San Diego District Office where he gained experience in many functional units including project development and environmental analysis. He was the Project Director for the South Bay Expressway, a toll road developed through a public-private partnership arrangement. He began his involvement in the Transportation Research Board (TRB) while at Caltrans and has continued his activities as a member of the TRB Environmental Analysis in Transportation Committee (ADC10), where he assumed the Chair in 2009.

Stoll received a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Civil Engineering in 1983 and a Master's degree in Business Administration (M.B.A.) in 1985. Both degrees were earned at San Diego State University. He has been a Registered Professional Engineer in the State of California since 1988.

Stoll is a "native" southern Californian and has lived in San Diego since 1980. He and his wife of over 25 years, Julie, have two teen-age sons – Alex, 19 and Daniel, 16.
